There will even be a jailbreak on Sun.! 35-50 of the Cowagraphers will arrive Friday night and perform on Saturday and Sunday. They will camp out behind the facades. We will also have the Celtaires play their traditional/Irish/Gaelic music just east of the jail. This band is paid for by your volunteer hours at the LanTex showing of Gran Torino. The Celtaires will play from 10-6 on Saturday, in between skits of the Cowagraphers.

Roof restoration update. We ran into a SNAFU with the Texas Historical Commission regarding restoration of the roof, but this seems to be resolved. The THC was concerned that the roof should not be restored until the foundation was stabilized. As you know, there are serious cracks in the jail due to subsidence of the foundation. However, our roof contractor, Dennis Masterson, will be repairing flashing and other areas that need immediate attention due to rain POURING into the attic. He will not be altering the placement of the roof. Many thanks go to Sarah Franklin for dealing with the THC on this issue, and to Tom Dalrymple, Mike Reagor and everyone else behind the scenes making this restoration project work.

Jail trivia dug up by Ned Woodall.

Before the Red Top was built, a jail called the Calaboose was built in 1882 on the SE corner of the square for \$7,600.

The jail was moved from the courthouse square by court order on Jan. 11, 1894. Decision affirmed on appeal Jan. 2, 1895.

In Feb., 1895 the land was bought from John W. Simpson for \$475.

Plans for the Romanesque Revival jail were accepted on Feb. 27, 1895 from F.B and W.S. Hull, agents of The Pauly Jail Building and Mfg. Co. of St. Louis, Mo.

John Goodman was appointed construction supervisor in March for \$75/mo.

The building was started in June or July. Goodman began receiving pay in late June.

Construction was completed Dec., 1895 for \$11,500.

In 1911, \$17 was spent to repair and repaint the roof. Owen and Stanley did the work.

The first toilets (steel stools) with flushing devices were installed in 1917 and connected to the city sewer.

In 1948, \$23,056 was spent for major repairs to the jail, including patching cracks in the walls and new flashing on the roof. 23 strips of steel were put in the defective parts of the wall in the mortar line.

Gas heaters were installed on the second floor in Nov., 1950.

The county's prisoners were housed in the building until 1982 (from Wayne Brascom).

The jail was put on the National Register of Historic Places in 1977 and became a Texas Historic Landmark in 1979.

The Llano Chapter of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas had their office in the jail in the 1990s.

<u>Thanks, Ned</u> for your hard work. This stuff is great! Ned's chronicle will be part of the master plan prepared by our historical architect, Karl Komatsu.

What else? Ain't nobody here but us chickens, right? We scratch a lot, but sometimes we get! The Jail now has a LARGE sign that will be placed out front honoring our donors. The original limit for donation to be included on the donor sign was \$1000. However, at our last meeting, we decided that we need to lower the donor categories to \$100, \$200 or \$500. There's also a new sign on the jail front that advertises jail tours on demand. Tom Dalrymple has given several tours and we are anticipating much more interest in the jail from this 24/7 response. Of course, "The Mayonnaise Jar" for donations is always highly visible during these tours!

Latest grant news. THC bailed on us this year due to the hurricanes and losing money in the stock market, but they are entertaining applications for next year. We will reapply.

We will also apply for \$2000 from the Llano Co. HOT to help host us for the TX Proud Festival for meals, advertising and sponsoring of the Brazos Bottom Cowagraphers.
